1. Ministry Literacy Assessments taking place this week (Jan 25th to Jan 29th) for all Grade 10 students – Thank you to Ms. Bombino for use of the library and her assistance with the exams invigilation
2. School Wide Discussion on Anti-Racism – developing a school perspective on the topic
3. One-week rotation starting in Quarter 3 – revised calendar sent home with students and emailed to families
4. Revised approach to Q3 and Q4 – 2 additional face-to-face times for Gr. 8s during Flex Time (Remote Instruction Week). 3 Interactive opportunities per week for all grades.
5. Scheduling for 2021-2022 underway. Scheduling as if September 2021 will be business as usual but planning for the eventuality that it will not.
6. School Wide Messaging – Students from other schools using Templeton as neutral ground. Culture of silence makes it difficult to resolve situations. Students needing a reminder to adhere to PHO guidelines – in particular after school hours. Seeking support from families to reiterate and reinforce PHO guidelines.

TEACHERS' REPORT FOR PAC MEETING / January 26, 2021 **Appendix iii | Teacher's Report | GB**

Thank you from staff for the recent gaming funds approved for our various programs.

We had announced the news to staff earlier, but since Jim's official notification there have been many more messages of thanks to you all.

- 1) **January 15th marked the first Black Shirt Day recognized in our schools.** Many students participated by wearing black shirts, the library display featured a variety of anti-racism and civil rights materials.
- 2) **LITERACY EXAM WEEK (Jan. 25th – 29th) for all Grade 10s.**
 - Information has been posted since the beginning of January. Students should be aware of where to report (either Room 221 or the library) to take the exams.
 - We ask that students arrive at least 10 min. in advance to take care of the administrative details, so exams may begin on time at 10:30.
- 3) **COURSE PLANNING:**
 - Counselors have completed their presentations to students.
 - Mr. Leung & Mr. Mark have a meeting tonight with parents of senior students (next year's Grade 11s and 12s)
 - Students now have a bit of time to decide which courses they want.
 - Course Registration opens on Mon. Feb. 1st and runs until Feb. 8th
- 4) **CHANGES TO THE SCHEDULE FOR QUARTER 3 & 4**

Starting Thursday, February 4th

 - Students will alternate on a weekly basis, rather than every 2 weeks. This should address some of the concerns expressed.
 - The biggest change is for Grade 8s, who will now be meeting with their Remote Classes, **in person, during Flex Times A or B.** All Grade 8s will be required to be on site for their remote classes, on Tuesdays and Thursdays. And there will be a third interactive opportunity for Grade 8s (either a guided remote lesson, or another in person session)
 - Whenever possible, **we recommend that students not be in the building when they do not have face-to-face classes or sessions with their remote classes,** however we understand there will be students who will be in the building and we are still uncertain as to how this is going to look in reality.
 - The Library schedule remains the same. We have been open from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. daily, open at lunchtime and during Flex Times. Again, students are asked to check the library website for any changes to the schedule due to meetings, etc.
My expectation is that students will still adhere to the same rules that have been in place during the first 2 quarters. Physical distancing, minimal mixing of cohorts, mask wearing. The library **is not an area for students** to congregate and socialize, or play computer games. Nor is a space for students to eat their lunches. However students are most welcome to sit, read, and do some work.
